

Cathy Enright Scholarship

2018 Call for Submissions

The Cathy Enright Scholarship was established to help advance the aquaculture industry through supporting students demonstrating outstanding research work related to the industry.

Cathy Enright is a retired professor from the former Nova Scotia Agricultural College (now the Dalhousie University Agricultural Campus) and is a lifetime member of the Aquaculture Association of Nova Scotia (AANS).



The AANS will host the Sea Farmers Conference on January 25 & 26, 2018 at the Delta Halifax. The conference is \$50 (early-bird) for students to attend, but free for scholarship finalists. To find more details, please visit our website at www.seafarmers.ca.

As part of the conference, finalists will deliver a 3-4 minutes presentation on their research to the delegates at the beginning of each sessions on the Thursday January 25th. A panel of judges will evaluate the presentations and determine the winner. The winner will be announced at the beginning of the R&D session on the Friday January 26th.



The AANS was founded in 1977 and is governed by an elected board of directors and is mandated to develop viable businesses, defend the industry's position within government, secure funding, promote responsible aquaculture and assist with improving existing operations.

Scholarship Details

Prize: \$500

Who: Honours, M.Sc. and Ph.D. students studying in Nova Scotia who are conducting research projects related to aquaculture (any field).

*students who have recently defended their thesis are still eligible to apply.

Deadline: January 12th, 2018

How: Submit your abstract (200 words) to Dr. Isabelle Tremblay at rdc@seafarmers.ca

Process: A panel of judges will review the abstracts and the top 3 candidates will be notified by email by January 17th 2018.

*Finalists will be required to deliver a 3-4 minutes (3 minutes thesis style) presentation about their research, followed by 1 minute question period, during the conference day on Thursday
